BY-LAW NO. $\underline{768}$
A By-Law regulating unnecessary and annoying noises.

WHEREAS section 362 of The Municipal Act provides in part that "the council of any municipality may pass by-laws for regulating or prohibiting the ringing of bells, except church and school bells, blowing or horns, beating of drums, and other noises liable to disturb or annoy residents of the municipality."

NOW THEREFORE The Local Government District of Alexander in Council assembled enacts as follows:

1. In this by-law, "noise nuisance" shall mean any unnecessary noise which is liable to annoy, disturb, or detract from the comfort, repose, health, peace of safety of any resident of the District.
2. Except to the extent permitted by this by-law, no person shall make any noise nuisance or permit a noise nuisance to be made on his property.
3. This by-law does not apply to:
(a) Noise produced by construction or agricultural operations unless such noise is clearly of a longer duration or of a nature more disturbing than reasonably necessary;
(b) The ringing of church or school bells; or
(c) Any activity, work, or undertaking which would otherwise be prohibited by this bylaw where a permit has been issued by the Resident Administrator.
4. Every person who contravenes or fails to obey this by-law is guilty of an offence and, is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding $\$ 1,000.00$, in addition to costs, and in case of non-payment of fine and costs, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 30 days.
